

PORTABLE RADIO

Your Philco radio is a superheterodyne receiver using four tubes plus a selenium rectifier. As a portable radio it may be operated anywhere from its self-contained batteries, or it may be plugged into the house lighting system and operated from 115 volts, either alternating or direct current.

INSTALLING BATTERIES

CAUTION: Use only the batteries specified for your model. "A" Battery

Type P31 is used in Models E-670, E-672, E-675, and E-676. "B" Battery


Type Pi76 is used in Models E-670, E-672, and E-675.

Type P190 is used in Model E-676.

Unsnap the two buttons at the bottom of the cabinet and lift the back cover. To install the "A" battery, attach the plug connector and slide the battery into the cabinet alongside the speaker. To install the "B" battery, attach the snap connector and place the battery on top of the "A" battery and bracket as illustrated.

BATTERY OPERATION

Unsnap the cabinet back and insert the power-cord plug into the slot provided in the changeover switch. See illustration. CAUTION: The plug must fit over the switch as illustrated, with only the lower prong of the plug inserted in the slot nearest the volume control. Fold the power cord and place it in the space provided, as shown in the illustration. Then close the cabinet back.

NOTE: Be sure that the radio is turned off when not in use. If reception becomes weak or distorted, have the batteries checked by your Philco Serviceman. Replace with new ones if necessary. If the radio is to be stored for a long period of time, remove the batteries to prevent damage to the cabinet.

HOUSE CURRENT OPERATION (115V, A.C. or D.C.)

Unsnap the back of the cabinet and pull the power-cord plug out of the slot in the switch. This automatically disconnects the batteries. Bring the power cord out of the cabinet through the upper corner of the back, or between the two snaps on the bottom of the cabinet cover if desirable.

TO OPERATE RADIO

Turn on the radio and select the desired station. After the exact setting of the tuning control has been made, adjust the volume to the desired level with the volume control. Do not control the volume of the radio by changing the setting of the tuning control.

CLEANING THE CABINET

Use a weak, lukewarm solution of soap and water to clean the cabinet. After cleaning, remove all traces of soap and then wipe with a dry cloth. Never use abrasive soaps, furniture polish, or cleaning solvents. If desired, use any neutral leather polish to restore the cabinet's lustre.
