

"SERVICE BY INDEPENDENTS" TO RECEIVE NEW EMPHASIS IN PHILCO PLANS FOR 1958

A new emphasis will be placed on "service by independents" during 1958, in line with Philco's policy, according to Henry T. Paiste, Jr., vice president in charge of service. Part of Philco's program includes

an Independent Philco Centralized Service plan, which is now being used in a number of Philco distributor areas. It provides in-warranty service for retail dealers who have a need for it.

The retail dealer is advance-billed for service by the distributor, and from that point, the plan works in one of two ways:

1) In metropolitan areas, dealers and users call the distributor when service is needed. The distributor then assigns the call on a "per call" basis to an independent service shop with which an agreement has been made.

2) In smaller centers, and all outlying areas, the distributor arranges with independent service shops to handle installations and service on a contract basis.

When, and to what extent, Philco's new program will be employed in each locality will be left up to each Philco Distributor. "Independent Philco Centralized Service has been operated with great success in Los Angeles for three years," Henry Paiste pointed out, "and the program is now being introduced in Chicago, Philadelphia, New York, and many other markets."

In Los Angeles, Robert M. Myers, service manager of Philco Distributors Inc., has been responsible for the development of this program, with the assistance of Carl Wilson, factory service representative. Some sixty independent service contractors are taking part in the program, and each call is assigned to the closest contractor. It is reported that retailers, service agencies, and particularly the Philco owners in this area are all enthusiastic with the effectiveness of this plan.

Retail dealers which maintain their own service departments will, of course, continue to handle their own service.

For more than five years, Philco has been laying the ground work for the new Independent Philco-Centralized Service program. The success of this program made it possible to handle service requirements in a number of areas, and permitted Philco to close all of its Factory Service Branches.

With its slogan, "Wanted Across America—10,000 gold-plated Philco Service Agencies!," Philco has searched out and recorded the names of thousands of prospective shops. Many of these will be taking part in the new program.

For more than 27 years, Philco has relied on independents to maintain its products in consumer homes. To provide service information, the Philco Factory-Supervised Service program sends technical data to service technicians directly by mail. In addition, training material is provided for service training meetings held at Philco distributors for independent service technicians.

Philco also is continuing to spend millions of dollars each year in direct labor allowances to independent shops and service technicians for product service. About six thousand independent Philco auto radio warranty stations have been receiving payment for service work directly from Philco for many years; and, in 1957, several thousand independent service shops signed agreements to handle in-warranty Philco radio and phonograph repairs, with payments being made directly from the factory. This program will continue to operate in 1958.

Henry Paiste stated, "Since 1932, Philco has distributed more printed service information and trained more independent service technicians at Philco distributor training centers than any other manufacturer in this industry." He said, "A professional service job doesn't just happen — it results from professionally trained independents e q u i p p e d to do superior work and backed by a professional reputation."





"Here are stands to hold record changers for servicing, which take nearly all of the changers made. The bases are tempered preswood board 6-1/2 in. x 8 in. A piece of 3/8-in. pipe 7 in. long is mounted on the board with a flange. "T" bars are made from 5/16-in. square stock — the top is 12 in., and the vertical part is 11 in. For vertical adjustment, a 1/4-in. thumb screw is threaded into the pipe 1 in. from the top. V-shaped strips (left over from air conditioner installations) are mounted on the top of the "T"."





"To clean a standard coil tuner, we remove osc. and R.F. coils Nos. 6, 7, 8, 9, 10, 11, 12 (unused channels in this area). It is then an easy matter to clean the stationary contacts with a good cleaner. The coil contacts of all *used* channels are cleaned with any ordinary rubber eraser. The unused channel coils are not replaced, since this allows the stationary tuner springs to relax between tuning from channel to channel. Unused channel coils should be left with the customer in case the set is moved to a different area."
